Bedford student raising money

Celebrating its 20th anniversary, the Massachusetts Breast Cancer Coalition is calling on mothers, daughters, sisters and their loved ones to support breast cancer prevention by participating in the organization's annual Against the Tide swim, kayak, walk or run fundraising event.

Robert Ackerman, a student at John Glenn Middle School in Bedford, has never lost anyone close to him to breast cancer and he intends to keep it that way.

At just 13, he has attended every Massachusetts Breast Cancer Coalition's "Against the Tide," event since his birth in 1998. His loyalty to the event runs in the family, as his mother, Lisa Freed, has participated in every "Against the Tide" for the past 18 years and is repeatedly the organization's leading fundraiser, having raised over \$20,000 for the cause.

At this year's event on June 18, he will participate for the second year in the 5k run, and for the first time he will team up with his mom for the kayak portion of the event, having kayaked solo last year. The MBCC is the only breast cancer organization locally and nationally that focuses on breast cancer prevention.

"The best thing is Rob has never lost anyone close to him to breast cancer," said his mother. "Prevention is working, treatment is helping, and I'd like it to stay that way. He only knows survivors, and

that's a darn good thing."
